on the morning of June 21, 2011, I met with Sac  
County Sheriff Ken McClure @ my home in Early.

I confirmed to Sheriff McClure that I did  
help Mona Wehde clean out and go through her son  
Dustin's bedroom after his death in December of  
2001. While going through Dustin's room, we did find  
a note book that contained some writings and  
a phone number. Mona and I could not understand  
what Dustin had written. It was like it was in  
a code. We called the phone number and found out  
it was a motel in Des Moines, IA. I can  
remember that the note book was small and  
black. I was shown a picture of the note  
book by Sheriff McClure. I identified the note  
book as being ~~the same~~ <sup>RLP</sup> identical to the one  
found. I was then shown a photo of a page  
from inside the note and identified it as what I  
had seen. There were a lot of pages with weird short writing

I have known Dustin since he was about  
age 3. Dustin in fact worked at Cross Boards  
for me doing dishes for a short period of time  
During that time I repeatedly had to re-instruct  
Dustin on his duties and how to do them. Dustin  
would become frustrated with adults who tried  
to explain things to him. Dustin was a mellow  
dramatic person. If he had a hang nail, you would  
think his finger was ~~falling~~ falling off. He did

## Supplemental Report

On the morning of Tuesday June 21, 2011, I met with Robyn Padgett at her residence in Early, Iowa for a follow-up interview. Padgett is reported to have been present when Mona Wehde found a notebook in the bedroom of her son Dustin after his death.

Robyn Padgett is the owner of Cross Roads Café in Early, Iowa, and is a close personal friend to Mona Wehde. After Dustin's death, Robyn was with Mona Wehde when she searched through Dustin's bedroom. During this search, Padgett stated that they found a little black notebook that had what she reported as coded writing in it. Padgett said that there was a lot of writings on different pages of this notebook that did not make any sense to them. Padgett could not remember the exact date in which they went through Dustin Wehde's bedroom. She did say that there were post-it notes all over the place and that they did find a phone number that they called. It was a motel in the Des Moines, Iowa area. Padgett stated that Mona Wehde did not immediately turn this note book over to authorities. I showed Padgett a photograph of the black composite note book that was turned in to former Deputy Sheriff Dennis Cessford on December 24, 2001. Padgett was able to identify this notebook as being identical to the one found. I then showed Padgett a photo of some of the "coded writing" as she described that came out of the notebook turned over to Deputy Cessford. Padgett identified the writing as the same type of writing she had seen in the notebook.

Padgett and I talked about a couple e-mails that I had received from Tracey Roberts in March of 2005. The first one we talked about was the one dated MARCH 11, 2005. Padgett was able to confirm the contents of the first paragraph and stated that she (Padgett) did talk with Mary Higgins and did tell her about the notebook found in Dustin Wehde's bedroom. Padgett stated that she spoke often to Mary Higgins, and that Mary Higgins was always trying to get Padgett to befriend Tracey Roberts. Padgett always felt that Higgins was trying to get information from Padgett. Padgett also said that Mary Higgins was the one who told her about a ski-mask. Padgett said that she had taken pages of notes from conversations she had with Mary Higgins. Padgett thought she had thrown this note book out a couple years ago, but was going to check in her basement for it.

Padgett is mentioned in the last paragraph of the second page of an e-mail I received from Tracey Roberts on MARCH 15, 2005. This e-mail talks about this notebook again that was found in Dustin

Wehde's bedroom. This e-mail goes to the content of the notebook. Padgett doesn't really recall number being written in the book as much as she recalls the "coded writing".

I asked Padgett to describe Dustin Wehde. Padgett reported that she has known Dustin Wehde since he was about 3-years old. He had what she described as an obsessive compulsive personality. Padgett said that he was one who did not have a lot of friends. She said that he was not a stupid person by any means, he did have problem relating to adults and taking direction or instruction from adults. She gave me an example of this. Padgett said that for a short time, Dustin Wehde worked for her washing dishes. Dustin Wehde had to be shown repeatedly on how to properly wash the dishes. Padgett said that this became very frustrating for both he and her. Padgett also described Dustin Wehde as someone who did not have a high pain tolerance. She stated "If Dustin had a hangnail, you would have thought his finger was falling off". She also said that if he was in a group of people and received a minor scratch, everyone would have known it. I asked her if she thought after Dustin Wehde had been shot if he would have tried to get up? Padgett said he would have laid there and cried.

Our interview ended and I wrote out a written statement. Padgett read the statement and signed it.

This ended my contact with Padgett on this day.
